

Mung beans

The major varieties of pulses grown in Ethiopia are: Horse beans, chickpeas, haricot beans, lentils, dry peas, vetches and mung bean. The Northern part of Ethiopia, is endowed with varied agro ecological areas and rich in diversified natural resources. Mung beans are high in nutrients and antioxidants, which may provide health benefits.



Soybean

Ethiopia's production in soybean has increased by over 100 fold in the last decade. And also it is, after conducted deep-dive analyses, one among the ten promising investment opportunities (Ethiopia is endowed with favorable climatic and soil conditions for production). Soybean grows in altitudes ranging from 1250-2200m.a.s.l. Performs well between 1300-1700m.a.s.l. can also be grown in an area receiving 450 to 1500mm annual rain fall.



Groundnut

In Ethiopia, groundnut is commonly produced for food, cash income, and animal feed. It is solely grown by smallholder farmers under dry land conditions in the lowland and drought-prone areas of the country.

Coffee

Coffee, Ethiopia's largest export crop is the backbone of the Ethiopian economy. The main coffee producing areas in Ethiopia are west and south west, southern, eastern, and central regions. On the basis of management level, vegetation, structural complexity, and agronomic practices, coffee production systems in Ethiopia can be categorized into four; namely: forest coffee (FC), semi-managed forest coffee (SFC), garden coffee (GC) and plantation Forest Coffee



Vegetables and Fruits

Fruits and Vegetables among the various agricultural products have gained a huge attention in the international trade and also have been well recognized in the health sector as an important part of a healthy diet. 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Oil Seeds

Ethiopia has an attractive portfolio of high value specialty oilseeds for export markets. It is in the top 5 producing countries for sesame seed, linseed, Niger seed., safflower seed, castor beans, soybeans, cotton seed, rapeseed etc. Oilseeds are produced in all regions of Ethiopia. Based on adaptation, oilseeds can be classified into three major categories highland oilseeds (noug, linseed, gomen/er). midland oilseeds (castor, linseed, noug) and lowland oilseeds (sesame, groundnut, safflower).



Sesame seeds

Sesame is among the most important oilseed crops in the country, mainly as a commercial export commodity. Sesame marketing has demonstrated highly significant growth. A large number of sesame seed varieties exist in Ethiopia. Among these, Humera, Gonder, and Wellega varieties are well known.



Black cumin

Black cumin production as a system has a long history in Ethiopian agriculture. It ranks second among the seed spices produced in Ethiopia in terms of production and area coverage. Black seeds were taken to treat headaches, nasal congestion, toothache, and intestinal worms. Black Cumin has a long history of uses for food flavors, perfumes and medicine.



Rapeseed

The central parts of Ethiopia produce the rapeseed. This place is perfect for planting the oilseed for it thrives at over 2391m in altitude. The place has the fertile red brown soil type that is rich in natural phosphate from the rocks. Rapeseed is the third-largest source of vegetable oil and second-largest source of protein meal in the world.

Niger seed

Ethiopia uses the niger seed for oil extraction for human consumption (as a cooking oil). Ethiopian exporters export niger seeds mainly to Singapore, the US and Europe. The market value as ingredient for the edible oil industry is unknown. Niger seed is being investigated in Europe now to explore the opportunities for applications in food products.



Linseed

Linseed has wide uses as a source of food, feed, fiber, oil, medicine, industrial raw material and export commodity. Linseed possesses a very healthy fatty acids (linoleic-Omega 6 and alpha-linolenic acids or Omega 3). Ethiopia allocated 181 thousand hectares of land for linseed and produced 0.16 million tons.



Sunflower

Sunflower is hardly grown at present. Hence, trials have started in Ethiopia to produce sunflower seed more professionally. Next to the normal sunflower seed, the high oleic varieties may offer export possibilities.
